Message from the President

The Association has had some significant changes in membership since our last Newsletter was circulated. During this period we fare-welled hardworking members Ken Cork, Michael Cole-King, Hugh Watson and Marion Watson, as well as our founding Secretary Annie Cork, all of whom have contributed enormously to the



development and maintenance of the Avenue and in the staging of associated events. We thank them for their efforts and look forward to maintaining our links with them through our Friends of the Avenue network.

Finding a new Secretary to replace the indefatigable Annie proved to be a challenge but that has now been resolved with the appointment of Fiona Anderson to the role. Fiona is bringing some fresh thinking to the way the Association conducts its business which will help us improve our management of communications, activities and events.

Another important change was the creation of the position of Vice President in recognition of the need for continuity in management of the Association's affairs and planning for succession as members retire or resign from management positions. We welcomed our new VP Craig Reedman who was unanimously elected to the position.

The Avenue continues to attract large numbers of visitors as evidenced by the increased traffic volume on Tinaburra Drive, the almost continual presence of visitors at the site and the number of people signing and providing comments in our visitor's book. We are nearing the end of the second book, with entries showing that visitors come from all parts of Australia and many from overseas. We were overwhelmed by the attendance of more than 2000 people at this year's Anzac Day Dawn service at the Avenue which demonstrates the continuing high level of community recognition of the attraction and significance of this National Memorial.

Amazing Turnout for ANZAC Dawn Service

In what is only the second commemorative service at the Avenue since its construction, the crowds and service were second to none. It was an atmospheric dawn service shrouded in light mist. It gave an authentic feeling on the Tinaburra Peninsula to parallel our ANZAC's landing at the Gallipoli Peninsula one hundred years earlier.

People travelled from all around Australia to be part of this service. Noteworthy was the catafalque party provided by 1 RAR Townsville who had all served in Afghanistan. Their precise drill movements were a credit to them and as they stood with their heads bowed with their weapons and provided a symbolic form of respect for those who have fallen. Throughout the commemorative service, they would have reflected on the memories of their mates whose names appear on the Memorial Wall.

Other Afghanistan veterans from 1 RAR, Officer Commanding C Coy, Major Julian Hohnen and CSM WO2 Adrian Ross respectively provided the Commemorative Address and the Remembrance Ode. Reference were made to people who served in all conflicts and paid the supreme sacrifice. During the service, Rt Reverend Bishop Tony Hall-Matthews blessed the new plaques that have been placed on the Memorial Wall. Wreaths were laid by a wide section of the services and community including families of the fallen.

As the service drew to a close, the Atherton resident Stanley family originally from New Zealand sang their National Anthem while Sharron Karsilkas sang our anthem. The service concluded with the dismounting of the catafalque party who then marched the full length of the avenue as a sign of respect for their fallen mates.

Avenue President Ray Byrnes organised the Lone Pine seedling planting ceremony that followed the commemorative dawn service adjacent to Avenue of Honour. The participants were descendants and relatives of Gallipoli and other WWI servicemen/women, WWII. Vietnam, East Timor and Afghanistan war veterans. The names of the servicemen and servicewomen with brief service histories were read out. A nominated family representative for each was invited to place a trowel of soil around the seedling. The participants formed a group around the planted seedling for unveiling of a plaque and dedication by Rev Bishop Tony Hall-Matthews followed by group photographs. A large crowd was on hand to witness the unique ceremony. The tree is flanked by Borneo raintrees which were previously planted to remember the survivors of the WW2 Sandakan "death march" which remains the greatest single atrocity committed against Australians in war.

The Atherton Venturer and Scout groups provided support with setting up and dismantling marquees, chairs and providing a public address system. The 144 ACU Army cadets were also in attendance and were able to interact with the regular soldiers in attendance.

Ray Byrnes was ecstatic with the turnout for the day and said that the committee is looking forward to now organising the Remembrance Day service.

Honouring the ANZACS - Lone Pine Tree Planting

Thanks to Vic and Kerri Riella, who donated a Lone Pine seedling from the Yarrumlumla Nursery in the ACT, we were able to include a tree planting ceremony in this year's Anzac Day Dawn Service programme at the Afghanistan Avenue of Honour.

Participants included local descendants and relatives of service personnel who were involved in Gallipoli and other WW1 theatres and all subsequent conflicts as well as surviving veterans of recent conflicts. In all 25 people took part in the planting ceremony, each adding a trowel full of soil to the planting site located just west of the Avenue of Honour. The site is adjacent to 3 Borneo Rain Trees planted previously in memory of those who perished as prisoners of war at Sandakan camp and subsequent death marches at the end of WW2.

The narrative of the battle of Lone Pine where 2287 Australians and some 7000 Turkish soldiers died over a 3 day period was read and a plaque recording the event was unveiled and dedicated by Rev Bishop Tony Hall-Matthews.

The names and brief histories of the service personnel represented were read out during the planting ceremony. Information available on each varied depending on the extent of family records, but the combined histories provided a fascinating snapshot of those men and women and the service they gave for their country in time of war.

In this issue of our Newsletter we have included a summary of the veterans and their representatives.

More than a minute's silence...This year, in conjunction with the ANZAC Centenary, Walking Wounded is undertaking an epic Tribute to the ANZACs – a seven-month, international journey to pay tribute to our 42 young men lost in Afghanistan. The Roll of Honour (Afghanistan) will be escorted by Families of the Fallen and returned Australian soldiers.

In support of this amazing event, the Afghanistan Avenue of Honour Association is asking all Friends to support the walk in Stage 2. The Traverse of Australia will see the team walk and run 65km per day for 65 days, from Cape York to Port Welshpool, Victoria. This will be followed by a kayak across the Bass Strait, to complete the final kilometres to Australia's most southerly point, South East Cape.

Join us to cheer on and show our support to the group as they pass through Mareeba on the *Traverse of Australia*. The Cairns to Townsville leg will occur between 13 – 21 June 2015. This is most poignant as the group will pass through our area around the second anniversary of the opening of the Avenue of Honour.
